Here are my small and simple items I brought to our August meeting. On far left is a Live Edge Plum bowl finished with Waterlox. The other two are laminated wood blanks. I got them at a retiring member's moving sale. I call it my Dr. Suez collection. The whimsical bowl, left, is where I practiced with different embellishing, a curved top, drilled holes, woodburning, and Dremel textured on the bottom edge. It is finished with wipe on poly satin. The small flower vase has a glass insert from woodturners catalog. It has simple woodburning and Dremel work. It is finished with spray on clear polynomials.

Shown here is the resin and Juniper vase I presented at the August meetng. It is about 10"h x 4.75"Diam. I used deep pour resin tinted with 3 contrasting green mica powders. The form was made up of 2 small coffee cans soldered together. For hollowing I used both free hand cutters and my deep hollowing jig. Yes, light does show through the resin features. It was sanded and polished for the finish, requiring many steps.
