
Gail is becoming a regular presenter of her wood art creations. At the December meeting she showed us 2 pieces. The first is a plate

Victor Larson (Correction).

In the November newsletter I reported that Victor used a finish on his bowls that formulated using Polyurethane, Linseed oil and Mineral oil. Mineral Oil is incorrect and MUST NOT BE USED IN THIS finish formulation. The correct formulation is as follows: It is a formula developed by Sam Maloof and consists of 1/3 polyurethane, 1/3 linseed oil, 1/3 mineral spirits. It results in a "slightly silky feeling" finish.
