

Announcements and News:

Club dues: We have had a number of members attending the club meeting who have not yet paid their dues. Our club dues for 2022 are \$25. You can pay at any meeting or you can mail a check to our treasurer, Steve Cabrol. The address is provided at the end of the newsletter.

Raffle Procedure Update: In January we changed the raffle process so raffle winners have a better chance getting the preferred item. Members now have the option to swap out their won raffle item if a later held ticket wins the preferred item. Members often put tickets in for more than one item to increase the chances of winning even though there is most always a preferred item. The returned items will be reraffled. Also the raffle will now progress item to item based on the quantity of tickets placed with each item, highest to lowest. Each members can still only win a total of 1 item. This process was used in January and it worked great.

April Project Challenge: April is a project challenge meeting. The theme for this project challenge would be to make anything you choose with the primary wood being "Bamboo". Woodcraft Supply is providing the Bamboo. At the meeting each member participating will receive a raffle ticket for a chance to win \$50. Some bamboo was distributed at the February meeting with more available at the March meeting. You can also contact Basil Borkert at 530-391-3620 as he picked up more Bamboo from Woodcraft. The Bamboo 3" x ½" comes as frames about 12" x



8". Each participating member is given 5 frames (20 pieces broken down). So be creative, think about what cool thing you make using bamboo.

Here are the 2 turnings and cutting board I presented at the February meeting. The salad bowl, left, is made with Bloodwood, Wenge, and Maple. The pot with the southwest pattern is Purpleheart, Maple, Wenge and Cherry. Both were finished with a shellac and poly finish. The cutting board has now been re-sanded with scratches removed as was shown at the club meeting. It is composed of Purple Heart and Padauk with a mineral oil finish.

Here is my latest wood art turning. I call it "Unsettled Universe". The wood is Silver Maple and the platter/bowl is 12"d x 2.25"h. As with previous pieces I used alcohol based dyes, applied, sanded and feathered out in sequence to produce the color and shading effects. The finish is sprayed on lacquer, rubbed out to a fine finish. The dyes in order of application are black, blue, magenta and yellow. The finial has black, yellow, red and orange to produce a flame like effect.
