

Ok, this is not my work. These 2 bottle stoppers were created by my Grand Daughter. She is about 17 and is an accomplished artist. She was visiting from Colorado for a few weeks and one of her favorite things to do is to work in Grandpa's shop. With very little instruction she took right to the lathe. It was not long before I was in the way.. The stopper shapes are her own design. The artwork she painted using artists acrylics. She mixed the paints to generate the colors and shading to her liking. Note, the tortoise and butterfly are all of 5/8". She has a real eye for detail. The stoppers are less than 4" or so. The top stopper wood is Manzanita and the bottom one is Juniper. The finish is lacquer. It was an absolute treat to have her in the shop.
