
## Arbortech presentation:

Arbortech has so many different power attachments to help you create a masterpiece. You're bound to find something perfect for you. Brian demonstrated about twenty different attachments, showing how they work and passing each tool around the room for members to see them up close. Some

attachments were designed to hog out wood quickly, while others were designed for finish carving on your project. All the carving tools have carbide cutting edges designed to stay sharp. All cutting edges can be sharpened by hand using a diamond sharpening card. The attachments did all seem to be of high quality construction. It was noted that Arbortech tools originated in Australia. The first bowl is Mulberry that was covered in mushrooms and fungi that was probably cut 1 to 2 years ago? There were lots of nice color variations and spalting. It is finished with 3 coats of Bullseye clear shellac. The second is a small crotch from a branch of Pear I picked up from Ron Sexton last year. It has beautiful grain and the bark stayed intact. It is finished with 3 coats of Watco Tung oil.

Thanks to the club for sponsoring Arbortech tools with a great presentation of their products. I definitely have some of them on my Wishlist.
