Placerville Boys and Girls Club Update: Auction this coming March:

The Fund Raiser month has been changed from January to March. Don't forget to work on your project(s) to donate to the Boys and Girls club fund raiser this coming March 2024.

Jim Hunt: When you are out of projects or want to make use of spare time, here is a list of things to keep your shop ready for the next project:

Tool maintenance during down time

Hand Tools

- -Blow out orbital, belt sanders, clean/empty dust catcher bag
- -Blow out electric motors
- -Charge cordless batteries
- -Check and repair/replace power cords
- -Oil air tools, oil quick disconnects, repair leaks
- -Sharpen chisels, scrapers
- -Replace blades on skill saw, saber saw, scroll saw, oscillating saw

Cutoff Saw

- -Blow out motor/under pivot table
- -Check adjustment for accurate Cuts (vertical and horizontal)
- -Replace/sharpen sawblade
- -Replace throatplate for zero tolerance

Table Saw

- -Blow out motor compartment
- -Lube adjusting screws (dry lube)
- -Clean/wax table
- -Change saw blade (Ken can sharpen the dull one)
- -Tune up blade, miter gauge and fence for accurate cutting

Band Saw

- -Blow out wheel/motor compartments
- -Replace Blade/Adjust block or bearing guides
- -Clean Wheels/inspect rubber wheels for wear
- -Tune up blade/table for accurate cuts
- -Lube adjusting screws

Lathe

- -Clean/Wax bed rails
- -Blow out motor
- -Check/Adjust live end and dead-end alignment
- -Shape up and sharpen lathe tools

Drill Press

- -Blow out motor and belt compartment
- -Spray or apply belt dressing to drive belts
- -Tune up table for a perfect 90 degree to spindle
- -Check drill inventory discard/replace worn/missing bits

Misc

- -Empty shop vac/clean/replace filter (inline Vortex canister is really beneficial for catching most debris)
 - -Drain water out of compressors
 - -Replace or dress grinding wheels/wire brushes
- -Stock up on standard items: A dry erase board on your shop door is a great way to keep a shopping list of materials/tools needed. Then just snap a pic of it when you go "shopping". Glue, sandpaper (common grits of: sheet, belts, discs), rags, tapes, disposable chip and acid brushes, spare AA, AAA, 2035 batteries Standard screws, pneumatic gun nails
 - -Clean/condition work benches, work surfaces
 - -Clean pipe, wood, C clamps of built up glue
 - -Weed out/replace worn tools like screw tips, router bits, etc
- -Weed out scrap wood...unless very expensive, anything under 12" long or square. If you haven't used it in a year, you probably won't...you will always develop more scrap to replace it!


