### Presentation, John Roberts:





For the September 10<sup>th</sup> meeting we had a presentation given by John Roberts. His objective was to share ideas and tips he has discovered that allow one to continue enjoying their woodworking hobby even with ones physical limitations.

He brought in a number of tools and jigs he has found useful, giving him the edge he needs to make woodworking a pleasant task. Some of the items he uses are shown in the picture on the left. In addition he described some features he has added to his floor model tools to make adjustments/configuration changes easier that would normally be a strain. One example was a motor control he added to his drill press for raising and lowering the table.

The presentation prompted a number of discussions and contributions from our members.

January 14<sup>th</sup>: In planning stage.


