### September Presentation, Router Table Usage, John Brideson:



For September John Brideson, our club founder, gave a presentation covering the features, benefits and usage of a router table in the shop. He brought with him his router table to show members some of the features that make the this tool so useful. During the presentation he did some router machining to demonstrate the table in use. He pointed out that the main advantage of having a router table is the control you have over routing materials versus free hand using jigs, as a result it is safer. Some of the main table features discussed included router bit storage, dust collection, miter slot, router

lift, and fence. There were numerious questions from the floor which prompted some great discussions on the topic. Note, there was no cleanup required from the wood machining due to the very efficient dust collection of John's setup. Thanks John.

## September Project Submissions (4 Members):

### Micky Dupper



Here is my Woodman I brought to the September meeting. It is a Cedar log 10" diameter by 17" tall. I used a Arbortech power carver to rough it out. The rest is a lot of Dremel work. I used Sabur Tooth and Kutz all bits for faster cutting and smaller bits for finer detail. I did a little woodburning detail on the Oak leaf head, eyes and mouth. It is finished with TWP (Total Weather Preservative) Natural. This was my first large size carving. Lots of fun trying something different.

Here is my show and tell for the September meeting. A winged bowl from a Walnut crotch. The cracks and bark inclusion voids were filled with Starbucks Via instant coffee powder and thin CA glue. The finish is wipe on poly.

Here is the project I showed a the September meeting. It is a Tangent Stave bowl with Plum, Mahogany, and Walnut woods. It is about 5"D x 4"H. This is the 1st I've done of this type and it was a challenge but I enjoyed doing it. I may do another one using different woods.

#### Gail Cone



Here are the 2 pieces I showed at the September meeting. The dyed ring bowl is 10" Dx 2"H and is turned from Silver Maple. The top is rubbed out Lacquer. The vase is 9"D x 5"H and is resin with Mistletoe Root. It required 2 liters of resin and was cast in a 2.5 liter bucket. The coloring was black, gold and silver pearl mica powders. The top ring is Redwood Burl dyed black. It was sanded to 2000 and polished using Meguiars automotive polishing compounds. It was then waxed on a Beall Buffing wheel.
