Hardwoods Presentation:



We were treated to a great presentation by Manuel Lavrador, Operations Manager at HARDWOODS Rancho Cordova/Sacramento. The HARDWOODS store is located at the facility that was previously Aura Hardwoods. Their customer base is primarily commercial however the Rancho Cordova store also sells retail. HARDWOODS has up-words of 35 stores under the HARDWOODS name however that is just a subset of the larger company. Stores are located throughout the US and Canada.

Besides lumber they have a large range of specialty products. The lumber sizes available for most of their popular wood products come in 4, 5, 6, 8 and 12 quarter. They carry a few tropical wood species in 4 and 8 quarter.

Manuel (he goes by Manny) impressed our members by his breath of knowledge in wood species, their cost, availability, characteristics, comparisons and work-ability. He brought a number of wood samples with him to use during his presentation. He spent some time talking about each and answering questions. This writeup could not do justice to all the information provided. However here is just a small sample.

Hardwood trees are defined by plants that produce fruit, nuts, flowers where as softwood trees (conifers) produce bare seeds, like in pinecones. Manny explained that from region to region within the same species wood characteristics such as size, hardness and color can vary widely. These differences are caused by local soil types, and weather.

He was asked if they carry Baltic Birch. The answer was no, as it turns out the original Baltic Birch is produced in Russia and they choose not to buy Russian products. They do sell alternative products that are actually produced in the U.S. that have the same characteristics.

We would like to thank Manny and his son Ray (who also works at HARDWOODS) for visiting us and giving such an informative presentation. This will go down as one the best Company/Organization presentations we have had.
